Letter from the President

In the aftermath of the October 7th Massacre, Israel began fighting for its survival. It faced serious threats from multiple directions—Hamas in Gaza, Hezbollah in Lebanon, the Houthis in Yemen and more. To add insult to injury, a surge of hostility towards Israel and the Jewish people occurred on college campuses and social media platforms. Antisemitic crimes rose drastically throughout much of the Western world.

The Philos Project stood throughout in unwavering solidarity with Israel and the Jewish people. Despite trip cancellations and waves of antisemitic propaganda, Philos continued its mission by shoring up support among alumni and partners, building coalitions against antisemitism, and countering misinformation as it spread through Christian communities. We amplified our message via social media, campus visits, articles, videos, podcasts and more, significantly grew our social media following on every platform, and became one of the most trusted friends of Israel and the Jewish people in America—at a time when many apparent friends went silent or simply went to the other side.

This record is more than a summary of activity—it's a testament to our resilience, growth and purpose as one team standing strong for one cause. Together, we've turned challenges into opportunities, standing with Israel and the Jewish people in a time when steadfast allies are most needed.







Remembering 10/7 in D.C.

As the events of October 7th and their aftermath unleashed a global wave of antisemitism and unique vitriol against Israel, Philos Executive Director Luke Moon knew that the one-year anniversary would be a symbolic emblem which had to be claimed for justice and truth. To achieve this, he reserved the most notable spot on the National Mall in sight of the White House for October 7th, 2025, to claim the space in support of Israel and avoid the anti-Israel mob from taking the national spotlight.

It was from that moment that <u>The Philos Project</u> <u>mobilized our network and friends</u>. Having gathered a diverse group of over 60 partners and an incredible line-up of speakers and performers, we came together to support Israel and the Jewish people, remember the innocent lives lost on October 7th, and honor the heroes defending their communities against terrorism. With thousands

in attendance and an abundance of media coverage, the reality of American Christians' support for Israel and the Jewish people was brought to the forefront of the national dialogue. The now Vice President-elect delivered remarks calling for Hamas to release the remaining hostages being held in Gaza. Other moving contributions came from Omer Netzer, a soldier who served in Gaza following the October 7th Massacre as he performed his tribute song to fallen compatriots. The incredible list of speakers ran the gambit of faith backgrounds from Christian, Jewish, and Muslim and professional fields ranging from pastors, rabbis, comedians, public intellectuals, lawyers, academics, and artists.

As a Christian organization, it was an immense honor for Philos to carry the torch for Israel and lead the charge to commemorate this solemn anniversary. Our event ended with a march to the White House, holding posters with the faces of each of the victims of October 7th, along with the remaining hostages. This event galvanized the thousands who attended and inspired countless more people with the courage to stand against antisemitism and know they are not alone.



Philos Leadership Institute

APRIL & NOVEMBER 2024

In April of 2024, the Philos Leadership Institute (PLI) took a cohort of young leaders as one of the first educational programs to resume functions post-October 7th. PLI was **redesigned to focus on the ongoing case for Zionism in light of the threats post-October 7th** and find meaningful ways to help the Israeli people through volunteer work.

The successful recipe for PLI and its transformational experiences for participants is the unique mix of geopolitics and military strategy, cultural and historical excursions, and the West's spiritual foundation in Hebraic values. This year's PLI trips added two main elements to this mix: up-close and personal experiences of the sites of the October 7th massacres narrated by survivors and two days of service projects to ease the labor shortage in Israel.



BARZILEI HOSPITAL

A meeting with the hospital director in Ashkelon, where the major operations of the facility were temporarily underground due to rocket fire damaging the building.







KFAR AZA

A tour of Kibbutz Kfar Aza with Chen Kotler hearing the harrowing details of the attack and how Hamas ruthlessly exploited charitable efforts by the community to slaughter the maximum number of residents.

SDEROT

Visit to Sderot to see the site of a bombedout police station and how the city became the site of urban terrorism and warfare.



LEARNING ABOUT ZAKA

Heard devastating but poignant stories from ZAKA representatives in Beit Shemesh about how they go about meeting the humanitarian, religious, and criminal investigation needs of cleaning up scenes of terrorism, all at a volunteer level.



SERVICE PROJECT

The realities of the horrors of October 7th and the life of a nation at war left our group moved and inspired for action. For two days, we spent time at a Kibbutz in the north tending to the labor needs of an olive farm and forming bonds with the community.



ENGAGING WITH THE COMMUNITY

Broke bread with a Bedouin family to hear how their community lost loved ones on October 7th, and on a few occasions, used their Arabic language skills to hide Jewish Israelis.

Alumni Activism and Advocacy

This year, with our priorities focusing on media and mobilization, many PLI alumni stepped up and served as invaluable foot soldiers and ambassadors across the globe in the fight for Zionism and against antisemitism. Throughout 2024, our alumni have aided our unprecedented impact. They were an integral part of our pro-Israel rallies at Columbia, USC, Union Station, and the DNC. 

Solidarity Mission to Israel

JULY 2024

In July of this year, Philos Latino completed their second solidarity mission to Israel since October 7th, bringing together some of the most influential Hispanic pastors in the United States. In this immersive experience, Philos Latino sought to strengthen the participants' connection to Israel through key government engagements, diplomatic meetings with the Ambassadors of Guatemala and the Dominican Republic, and visits to powerful sites such as the Nova Festival site and Kibbutz Nir Oz in the South.



Soulful Shabbats

Philos Black Soulful Shabbat Dinners blend the traditions of Shabbat dinner with the warmth of Sunday meals to facilitate continued friendship between the Black and Jewish communities and celebrate a shared heritage. This year, along with its Exodus Soulful Shabbat Dinner, which closed the Philos Black Strategy Forum, Philos Black hosted its very first Soulful Shabbat Dinner in Lagos, Nigeria, at Christ-in-me Church. This groundbreaking event brought together the rich traditions of Friday night Shabbat and African American Sunday gatherings, celebrating the Philos Black trilogy of identity—Israel, Black America, and Africa. This historic moment marked a powerful intersection of faith, culture, and community, fostering unity and reflection across continents.

Van Jones, a CNN host and three-time New York Times bestselling author, is a visionary leader dedicated to bridging divides and fostering meaningful connections across communities. As the founder of Dream Machine, he partnered with Philos Black to co-host a Soulful Shabbat Dinner at the Museum of the Bible in Washington, D.C., creating a vibrant space for reflection, unity, and cultural celebration.



Monday Prayer Calls

Philos Black Intercessors is a cornerstone initiative that embodies the spirit of community and intercession within our network. Every Monday at 8:00 AM Eastern Time, Philos Black staff, network members, and friends gather virtually to lift up prayers of thanksgiving, share praise reports, and cover one another in prayer. This sacred time fosters connection and spiritual empowerment, creating a space where believers can support and encourage each other in their faith journeys.

Earlier this year, Philos Black hosted a special corporate prayer call for the National Day of Prayer (Thursday, May 2, 2024), amplifying our impact by uniting voices around the world in heartfelt supplication. This significant event highlighted our commitment to advancing Black-Jewish relations, faith leadership, and community resilience.



Africa Exchange Event

SEPTEMBER 2024

In September, Philos Black hosted their very first Africa Exchange event at the UN General Assembly, in partnership with SAiD Institute and Laddering Your Success. This was a groundbreaking success! This inaugural gathering of the Africa Strategy Working Group brought together 75 influential leaders and changemakers to explore pan-African unity and foster collaboration within the global African Diaspora. Participants engaged in thought-provoking discussions on strengthening connections for global exchange and community building. The event also served as a powerful platform to reflect on and express solidarity in remembrance of the tragic events of October 7th.



Philos Black Strategy Forum

NOVEMBER 2024

Krystal Bracy and Wendell Shelby Wallace of Philos Black hosted the inaugural Philos Black Strategy Forum: The Future is Now in Washington, D.C., convening thought leaders, partners, and advocates dedicated to advancing the shared histories and futures of the African and Jewish diasporas. Over three days, participants explored the intersection of faith, advocacy, and diplomacy, starting with a tour of the Museum of the Bible, which highlighted the Bible's cultural impact across global communities. The forum featured mission-visioning workshops, strategic planning sessions, and breakout discussions on diaspora engagement, sustainable partnerships, and leadership development. Attendees deepened connections through networking activities, including a Headshot Happy Hour, and culminated the event with the Exodus Soulful Shabbat Dinner, a rich celebration of faith and culture through music, reflection, and communal dining. The forum achieved a unified vision for Philos Black's future, setting actionable priorities and fostering innovative collaborations to impact communities across continents.

Introducing Christian Watch on Global Islamism

Christian Watch on Global Islamism (CWGI) aims to deepen Christian leaders' understanding of the complex issues at the intersection of religion, politics, and global security in the age of Islamism. Unlike traditional Islam, Islamism is a revolutionary politicoreligious ideology dedicated to creating Islamic states based on sharia, unification of said states into an ummah (pan-Islamic states, or caliphate), and purging all non-Muslim elements, especially Western influences in Muslim countries.

Despite its long history, there is relatively little Western understanding of how to adjust security and legal infrastructures to cope with Islamism. This failure stems from the so-called "research gaps," that is, lack of research and knowledge of vital facets of Islamist thinking on the conduct of war, human rights, and treatment of non-combatants (both enemy and allied), among others.

The CWGI explores three themes (modules), which have been critically under-researched according to AI analysis.

Dr. Farhad Rezaei is serving as the Director for Philos' new initiative, Christian Watch on Global Islamism.
